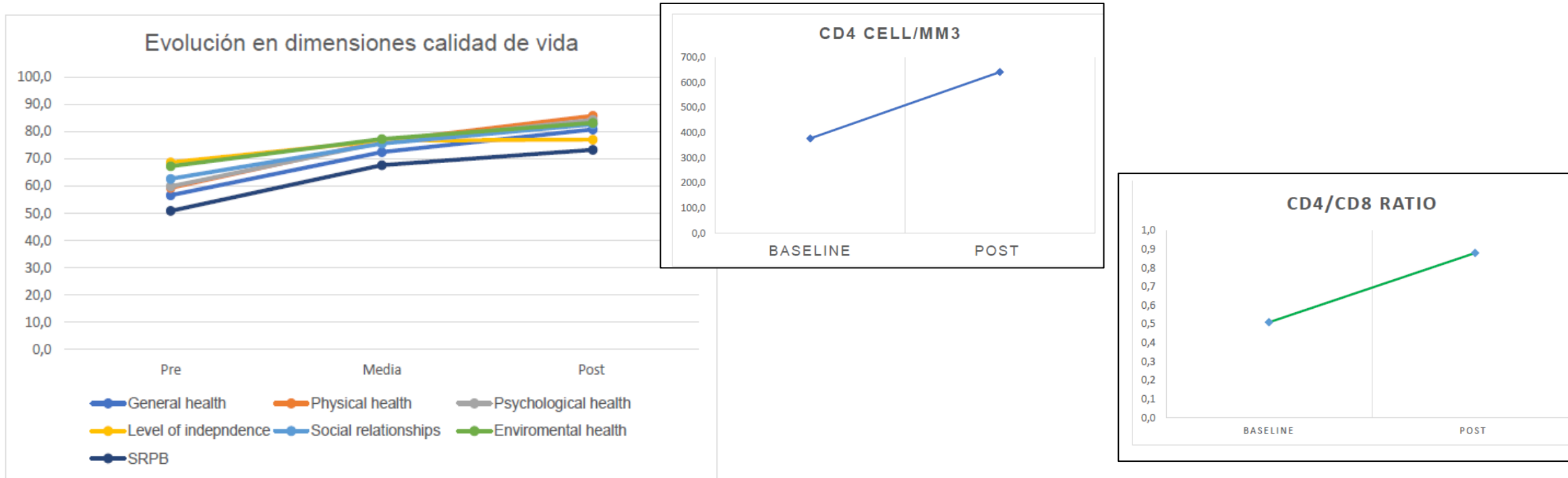

Access to health and social care granted in Seville and Andalusia for the migrant population.

- Involvement of the migrant population in the design, implementation and evaluation of all preventive activities by encouraging the participation of peer educators, community agents and intercultural mediators.



Beyond a sexual health clinic for the LGTBIQ+ community

- Single Point of Care: screening, diagnosis and treatment of major STIs and viral hepatitis.
- Open to the entire population regardless of gender, sex or sexual orientation.
- A friendly and confidential space for transgender people and sex workers
- More than 2500 people served by 2021
